

SERVICE COMMITTEE

February 18, 2025

The February 18, 2025 Service Committee meeting was called to order at 5:30 p.m. in Council Chambers by Dale Rowe, Chairman. Service Committee members present were Aaron Korte, Dale Rowe, and Andy Voorheis.

Others present included: Kyle McColly, Mayor; Doug Keller, Wastewater Treatment Plant Supervisor; Dave Schneider, Collections System Supervisor; Aaron Schoenberger, Water Treatment Plant Supervisor; Brad Taylor, Street and Sanitation Supervisor; John Walker; Brian Hemminger, Daily Chief Union; and Sarah Bennett, Clerk.

The summary of bills totaling \$133,709.07 was presented.

A motion was made by Mr. Voorheis, seconded by Mr. Korte, for the approval and payment of bills totaling \$133,709.07. Upon Voice Vote, all members voted Yes. The Chairman declared the motion carried.

The minutes of the February 3, 2025 Service Committee meeting, having been mailed to each Service Committee member, were approved as received.

Discussion was again held regarding the possibility of charging for cardboard dumpsters, as originally discussed at the January 21, 2025 Service Committee meeting. Mayor McColly indicated that he met recently with Mr. Russell Boes, Wyandot County Recycling Center Coordinator, and the Wyandot County Commissioners concerning this issue and he noted that it was a good preliminary meeting. Mayor McColly noted that he needs to meet with Mr. Taylor to gather additional information including the number of stops made to pick up cardboard in order to get a better idea of how to proceed.

Mr. Keller reported that he is preparing for another cold snap and issues were recently experienced with an alarm as snow was sucked into the headworks building and he was unable to get the alarm to clear. Representatives will be at the Wastewater Treatment Plant on Thursday to clear the alarm.

Mr. Schoenberger reported that the EPA conducted a sanitary survey today and the report from this survey is expected soon.

Mr. Schoenberger also reported that parts were ordered for the Water Treatment Plant's chlorine analyzer while everything else at the plant is running well.

Mr. Taylor reported that the automated garbage truck was delivered and training will begin soon. Mr. Taylor also noted that the toter garbage cans were also delivered and employees from the Street and Sanitation Departments are working to assemble these cans.

Mr. Taylor also reported that employees from the Street and Sanitation Departments worked to plow snow over the weekend as a result of the snow event that occurred.

Mayor McColly reported that bid packets are being prepared by Peterman Associates for the Koehler Lift Station Project.

Mayor McColly also reported that he along with Mr. Keller and Mr. Schneider met last week with the Louis Drefus Company working on agreements for the Valencia soybean processing facility to be located west of the City in Salem Township.

There being no further business, the Chairman declared the meeting adjourned.
